REGULATIONS FOR DOG SHOWS

The Federación Canófila de Puerto Rico, henceforth FCPR, is a non profit organization, registered at the State Department of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico whose objectives are science, sports and education. The dog shows organized by the FCPR and any ones authorized by it will be ruled by the following:

Rules:

Chapter 1

The organizing clubs responsibility is that the events he organizes and that are authorized by the FCPR, shall occur according to the current rules. For such purpose, the organizing club will designate a Show Chairman, who shall be the highest authority and the person responsible of the compliance of these rules, having the faculty to make any adjustments that he deems necessary, according to the needs of the premises, the weather and any other non predictable circumstances that can arise motivated by circumstances beyond control, but never by the demands of the exhibitors, visitors and people that directly take part in the celebration of the event. Furthermore, and conforming to the circumstances, he may appoint an Event Coordinator and an Event Director. At shows not organized by the FCPR, but authorized by them, FCPR discreetly and as deemed necessary shall name a Representative that will verify if the event is developing according to the Rules. The representative of the FCPR will have full authority even to cancel the event, if this does not comply with the present rules and the official norms of the FCPR.

Chapter 2

The shows shall take place the date, place and times stipulated previously by the organizing club and authorized by the FCPR and the activities shall occur based on the following:

- a.) The premises shall remain open at least two hours prior to start of the event.
- b.) The show shall start at the time specified in the Judging Program. A judging plan shall be printed for each show and shall be given to the Judges and exhibitors with the approximate times.
- c.) The dogs shall remain in the premises where the events occur during the entire time of judgment of their breed or they may be declared absent.
- d.) The dogs shall be present in the ring at the time required to be judged, at the indicated time and in the order established. Any dog that is not present in the ring where he shall be judged at the precise time he should, shall automatically be disqualified by absence, the judge at his own discretion, may allow 2 minutes maximum of tolerance.
- e.) The organizing club may offer surveillance at the facilities as best they can, but the dogs will be in the direct care of the exhibitors, which shall make sure they do not cause **DAMAGE TO THE PREMISES, TO OTHER ANIMALS OR THE VISITORS, ACCEPTING RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ACCIDENTS OR LOSES THAT MAY BE SUFFERED.** The dogs shall always be in the complete control of their owners and in their kennels.

Chapter 3

Any intention to defraud shall be subject to disqualification, loss and annulment of the awards obtained and sanction of the owner or person who has acted fraudulently. The judges, in any case, may consult with the Show Chairman or Representative of the FCPR.

Chapter 4

The judges' decisions are unappealable.

Chapter 5

The following shall be cause for automatic disqualification:

- a.) The ones specified by the standard.
- b.) Deafness, blindness, monorchidism, cryptorchidism, when the appearance of an animal has been artificially changed (surgery), if it is not specified in the breed standard. When the color or natural markings have been changed by the application of any kind of substance or paint, even though it might have been used to clean or for any other reason before the dog enters to compete. If any kind of drug is given to the dog to change his behavior.
- c.) Height or weight if specified in the breed standard. The determination may be:
 - 1.) Because it is the decision of the Judge;
 - 2.) Because a handler in the ring requests it from the judge, or because an exhibitor requests it in writing to the Show Chairman before 9:00 a.m. on the day of the show. A dog may only be measured or weighed in the cases stated in paragraphs 1 and 2, at the precise moment when the judging is taking place and never after the judging has already occurred. In the third case, the determination shall be by the Technical Committee before the judgment of the breed starts, if the petition was presented to the Show Chairman in the time required. The result of the ruling (height or weight) shall be written in the judges book and if the dog has been disqualified he shall not be able to compete.

The petitions shall always be presented in writing, prior cash deposit of the solicitor and a signature to prove it. The amount of the petition shall be \$50.00. The non-refundable deposit shall be for the benefit of the FCPR. Any dog that has been disqualified for the reasons mentioned in these paragraphs shall not be able to compete at any other show without the authorization of the Technical Committee of the FCPR. Temporary or permanent limp: a limping animal should not compete and will not be judged for which it will be excused from the ring by the Judge without having to consult the official veterinary of the show.

Double handling: double handling is prohibited, meaning, to call the attention of the dog that is being judged from outside or inside the ring, whether from his owner, any person, animal or thing, with the purpose of enhancing the features, movement or the specimen's character, subject to disqualification or annulment of the prizes awarded. The handler is the only person authorized to enhance the characteristics of his specimen. In the case that any assistant to the event is found doing double handling, they shall be reported and sanctioned by the FCPR.

Chapter 6

Dogs that have not been previously registered in the stud book of the FCPR with all the documents of their ancestors can not accumulate National or International championship certificates or Obedience titles (CD, CDX, UT). In this case it is important to emphasize that they should obtain their pure breed certificate (P.B.C.) or confirmation of their pedigree to accumulate certificates and obtain their championship title, except in World and Regional shows.

Chapter 7 ENTRIES

A.) To be able to participate as an exhibitor of one or several dogs, the dogs shall be entered using an entry form for one of the following:

CLASSES

- (1.) **PUPPY-A:** Dogs of three months and one day to six months, (presenting their vaccine certificate from a credited veterinary doctor).
- (2.) **PUPPY-B:** Dogs of 6 months and one day to 9 months of age.
- (3.) **JUNIOR:** Dogs of 9 months and one day to 18 months of age.
- (4.) **PUERTORRICAN BRED:** Dogs born in Puerto Rico that are not Puertorrican Champions. Only when offered.
- (5.) **INTERMEDIATE:** Dogs between 15 and 24 months of age.
- (6.) **OPEN:** Dogs that are not Puertorrican Champions, age or place of birth not being important.
- (7.) **WORKING:** For dogs that have passed the temperament test in the breeds that this test is required to validate the championship and that are not Puertorrican Champions. It is required they show the working certificate.
- (8.) **VETERAN:** Dogs older than eight (8) years and one day of age that compete for Best of Breed.
- (9.) **CHAMPION:** Exclusively for Puertorrican champions. Except the Puppy Class (A &B) and JUNIORS, all the above compete for the Certificate Awards for Puertorrican Champion. (CACP).
- (10.) **OPTIONAL CLASSES: DO NOT QUALIFY FOR CERTIFICATE AWARDS FOR PUERTORRICAN CHAMPION.**
 - a.) **BRACE:** Two dogs of the same breed that compete for best brace in show.
 - b.) **TEAM:** Four dogs of the same breed that compete for Best Team in Show.
 - c.) **STUD DOG:** Male dogs shown with at least three (3) gets that compete for Best Stud Dog in Show.
 - d.) **BROOD BITCH:** Bitches shown with at least three (3) gets that compete for Best Brood Bitch in Show.
 - e.) **EXHIBITION:** May enter to be shown but out of the realm of the regular competition: Dogs of some breeds not recognized by the FCPR.

A dog may only be entered in ONE CLASS in an event, even though it may be a circuit of several events, with the exception of the dogs entered in the Obedience trials, Agility and or exhibition classes (Brace, Team, Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Exhibition). In these cases they are required to fill out another entry form. When the entry forms do not have all the information of a dog (name, sex, registration number, date and place of birth, name of the sire, dam and the owners, class, date of show), the awards and certificates obtained shall be annulled.

Chapter 8

FOUR Certificate Awards for Puertorrican Champion (CACP) are required awarded by four different judges so that the FCPR may award a dog the title of PUERTORRICAN CHAMPION as long as it is a national open show. In each breed or variety of breed you can only have one male and one bitch with the right to obtain the Certificate Awards for Puertorrican Champion (CACP) which will be awarded, according to his criteria, by the Judge. He may abstain of awarding this if the dog does not meet the ideal breed standard. At specialty shows, the CACP may be awarded in different classes to both dogs and bitches. To ratify the title of Puertorrican Champion, the breeds that require Utility test, according to the FCPR, must pass the Temperament Test (TT) and in the cases where the FCPR indicates also the Certificate of Dysplasia clearance. These documents will be attached to stud book record of each dog. A dog of less than 15 months of age will not accumulate points towards his title of Puertorrican Champion. At specialty shows the title of Junior Puertorrican Champion may be awarded. In every breed or variety of the breed there may only be one reserve winners' dog and one reserve winners' bitch for the Certificate Awards for Puertorrican Champion (CACP). The FCPR may authorize other categories which will be announced before the event (Tournament of Champions, Grand Puertorrican Champion, Puertorrican Bred or Specialty Shows).

Chapter 9

The breeds recognized by the FCI, and adopted by the FCPR, are classified in ten groups as follows:

GROUPS:

GROUP I - Sheepdogs and Cattle Dogs (except Swiss Cattle Dogs).

GROUP II – Guard dogs, Protection and Utility (Pinchers, Schnauzers, Molossoid, Mountain and Swiss Cattle Dogs).

GROUP III – Terriers.

GROUP IV – Dachshunds

GROUP V – Spitz and Primitive Dogs.

Group VI – Scenthounds and Tracking Dogs

GROUP VII – Pointing Dogs.

GROUP VIII – Retriever Dogs.

GROUP IX – Companion and Toy Dogs.

GROUP X – Sighthound Dogs.

Chapter 10

ORDER IN WHICH THE DOGS SHALL BE JUDGED

- a.) The dogs shall always enter the ring with their handler who should have the number or bar code on his left arm with which his dog shall be competing. A dog's handler may be changed in the ring as long as it is authorized by the Judge who must have not finished examining all the dogs that are in the ring individually whether stacked or moving. (The change of the handler must be requested thru the Ring Steward).
- b.) The judging order is by Breed or Variety of the breed in each one of the groups and according to and in the order that the classes have been established in these rules.
- c.) All the dogs must enter the ring when the CLASS where they were entered enters the ring. If your class is preceded by another one you shall be in the «Pre-Ring» waiting to be called by the Judge or the Ring steward. The dogs will never be called by their entry numbers thru the sound system or microphone so the handler must be paying attention to the judgment of the breed.
- d.) First, the dogs shall be judged in each CLASS except the ones that have been entered in: Veterans and Optional Classes (Brace, Team, Stud dog, Brood bitch and Exhibition).
- e.) From among the dogs that obtain first place in their class (junior, open, utility and champion) with a qualification of excellent, the CACP shall be awarded to whom the Judge may give the Certificate for the Puertorrican Championship (CACP) if he deserves it according to the Judges opinion. Between the second in that same class, that has a qualification of Excellent, he shall compete with the other first class winners of the different classes to select Reserve Winner of the CACP.
- f.) The bitches shall be judged using the same procedure.
- g.) To pick the Best Puppy of the Breed, the first place excellent of category «A» and first place Excellent of category «B» of each sex shall enter into the ring. The winner shall go on to the finals as the representative of the breed. There shall only be one dog per breed at the finals judgment.
- h.) Best of Breed or Variety shall be selected from the CACIB winners dog, CACIB winners bitch, the Junior winners dog and the Junior winners bitch. After choosing the Best of Breed or Variety the judge shall select the Reserve Best of Breed. Whoever does not receive a CACP certificate or CACIB/CACLAB, will not be able to compete in the group.
- i.) Best In Show: the dogs that have obtained first places in each of the individual groups in which the competed in will compete for Best in Show.
- j.) Best Puertorrican Bred: for the award of Best Puertorrican Bred in Show the competition shall be between the dogs born in Puerto Rico that were entered in this non-regular category for the fee indicated in the entry forms.

Chapter 11

The cost of entries shall be determined by the FCPR or by the Association or Affiliated Club to the FCPR that organizes the event.

Chapter 12

CLASS AWARDS/PRIZES

In each placement the Judge shall qualify the dogs and will be able to, according to his criteria, give the following qualifications: EXCELLENT, VERY GOOD, GOOD, SUFFICIENT or he may decline the qualification. The judge shall write down the dog on the respective CERTIFICATE. A copy of this sheet will be given to the exhibitor as a result of his competing.

OPTIONAL CLASSES:

Best Brace – Winner: Award and Rosette.

Best Team – Winner: Award and Rosette.

Best Stud Dog - Winner: Award and Rosette.

Best Brood Bitch - Winner: Award and Rosette.

Prizes for these classes are only required if there is a minimum of three exhibitors entered.

ALTERNATE TROPHIES/TROPHIES – according to what was previously established.

- a.) The donator shall clearly establish the requirements to win, so that the trophy stays in the hands of the permanent winner. These requirements shall be printed in the Catalog.
- b.) The moment a dog wins the trophy for the first time, the aforementioned trophy shall be given symbolically and for the sake of the official picture taking, remaining in the hands of the Show Chairman or in any case the Organizing Club.
- c.) The alternate trophy shall stay in the hands of the FCPR or the Organizing Club until it is permanently won according to the rules in section (a) and will be taken by the donator or by the club to each event where they might compete for it.
- d.) The statutory size of the rosettes will be at the discretion of the person in charge of the show or of the committee of the FCPR and it is always required that they include the logo of the organizing club.

Chapter 13

CATALOG

For each show or show circuit a catalog must be prepared, the catalog must be prepared with all the dogs entered and it must be of the official size: 6” x 9”. For National shows the size may vary according to the event director. On the cover of the catalog it shall be previously indicated that the show is authorized by the FCPR that the organizing club is affiliated to the FCPR the date of the event or events, if the CACP or CACIB shall be awarded. The logos of the FCPR, FCI and Sicalam should also appear. The dogs in the catalog will be classified in the 10 groups used by the FCPR as the show is judged.

In the group, they will be classified by BREED in alphabetical order and in the BREED by CLASSES according to what is indicated in Chapter 7 of these rules. Due to weather conditions, the FCPR or the organizing club may start the judging of the brachiocephalic breeds as long as it is stipulated in the judging program. It is strictly prohibited to change the judging program established in the catalog.

The specific information of each dog entered shall include:

- a.) Class in which it shall compete.
- b.) Sex.
- c.) Catalog number.
- d.) Name, the one registered at the FCPR.
- e.) Registered number at the FCPR, microchip number at the FCPR (bar code).
- f.) Place of birth.
- g.) Date of birth.
- h.) Registered name of the sire at the FCPR.
- i.) Registered name of the dam at the FCPR.
- j.) Owner’s name / Address / Telephone / Signature.

It is strictly prohibited to accept the entry of a dog with a foreign registration. The registration must be previously validated by the FCPR except in the case of Regional or World shows. When a dog completes his Puertorrican Champion title during a circuit and the owner or handler would like to change it to the Champion class they shall have to fill out a Change of Class form, sign it and take responsibility for the veracity of such change. Otherwise, he shall be credited with the corresponding sanction. The person that signs the entry form is completely responsible of the veracity of all the information, subject to the exclusion of the dog, the owner and the authorized agents that filled out the entry form.

IT IS THE ORGANIZING CLUBS COMPLETE RESPONSIBILITY TO GET TO THE OFFICES OF THE FCPR IN A MAXIMUM TIME FRAME OF 15 DAYS, TWO CATALOGS OF THE EVENT THAT IT HAS ORGANIZED WITH THE ENTRY FORMS AND THE JUDGES BOOK PREVIOUSLY CLASSIFIED SO THAT THE FCPR MAY CONFIRM ALL THE RESULTS OF THE EVENT TO EACH OF THE DOGS. OTHERWISE, THE ORGANIZING CLUB SHALL BE CREDITED WITH THE FINE STIPULATED BY THE FCPR AND THE SUSPENSION OF FUTURE EVENTS.

Chapter 14 JUDGES

The judges chosen for an event must be previously authorized by the FCPR before being publicly announced. For no reason shall they judge more breeds than the amount authorized by the FCPR in their license unless it is due to circumstances beyond their control and always with the authorization of the FCPR.

Chapter 15 JUDGES BOOK

The judge's book may only be printed in the official format authorized exclusively by the FCPR.

- a.) The judge must always write his notes with ink.
- b.) The only person authorized to make notes in the Judges book during the event is the Judge.
- c.) Only the Show Chairman or the official representative of the FCPR, whichever corresponds, may make changes in the Judge's book during the event. The corrections or modifications of a classification awarded by a Judge may never be changed, subject to being expelled.

Chapter 16

RING STEWARDS FOR THE OBEDIENCE AND CONFORMATION RINGS

Ring stewards must be found in each ring. The first one will be inside the ring helping with all that is necessary like placing all the dogs and verifying that they are all in order, also certificates and trophies that shall be awarded and taking the Judge's book sheets to the Control table. The second one will be at the ring entrance to enter the dogs in order as the judging develops. It is strictly prohibited for the Ring stewards to make comments about the dogs that are participating or that they influence in the decisions of the judges.

Chapter 17

As they organize an event the clubs must elaborate a judging program taking into consideration an average three minutes for each dog, considering that the judge may not judge more than 175 dogs per day in one event without critique. At an event with critique the judge may judge 80 dogs per day. As the judging program is elaborated it must specify in what ring is each breed going to be judged and at what time, no breed may be judged before it's scheduled time unless of circumstances beyond their control, if this were the case the public and exhibitors shall be advised of the modifications that have been made at that time.

Chapter 18 JUNIOR HANDLERS

- a.) The participants will be entered in two (2) different categories: **from 7 to 10 years old – unofficial and from 14 to 17 years old – official**. The participants in this competition will only be judged for the ability and skill that they have to show their dog in the ring.
- b.) The judges for the junior handlers' competition must be people with knowledge in this area. No judge may participate if in the competition there are junior handles that are direct relatives or of any degree of relationship or children that without being relatives live with the judge. He also may not judge if one or more of the dogs are owned or co-owned by them.
- c.) The junior who would like to participate in this competition shall be entered in the corresponding category. The junior may be entered with more than one dog as long as he pays the fee to participate with each dog. They must be aware of the starting time of the competition, subject to be declared absent if not present.

Chapter 19

Depending on the space available at the show sight, the FCPR or the organizing club might authorize by means of previous agreement, the installment of commercial stands as well as awnings for the exhibitors. The use of signs and promotional material is prohibited if thought to be used to influence the decisions of a judge.

Chapter 20

No exhibitor may show his dog in the ring wearing any kind of advertising material on their clothing or accessories that indicate the name of the kennel, of the dog or to any business.

Chapter 21

The advertising signs of the show sponsors that are to be installed inside the show rings must have the regulated size of 3' x 8' and subject to the following dispositions:

Exclusive sponsorships. The sponsoring company may install the amount of signs stipulated by the FCPR around the rings, as long as they observe the stipulated sizes in the above paragraph and as long as they do not ruin the image of the show or interfere with the judging in the rings.

Co-Sponsorships. The sponsoring companies will be obligated to distribute their signs in the same amount with the stipulated sizes always depending on the availability of space in the rings.

Fees. The sponsor's fees and the sale of commercial stands or tents shall be previously stipulated by the FCPR.

Chapter 22

OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHERS

The official photographs taken for shows organized by the FCPR shall be exclusively after each breed or grouped in a photographic setting or podium installed for this purpose in coordination and under the responsibility of the events organizing club. It is strictly prohibited to take pictures inside the ring while the judging of the breeds is in progress. If the photographer does not comply with this rule they will be sanctioned or expelled for good by the FCPR and will not be able to take photos in any other event.

Chapter 23

Any dog that bites any person or dog inside or outside the ring will be suspended indefinitely and will not be given the chance to appeal. In this event, the owner or handler will be obligated to show the Vaccine certificates issued prior to the event.

The suspension may be a report from the Show Chairman or the representative of the FCPR received in writing from the affected person signed by witnesses that may be located.

Chapter 24

The certificates that will be used as awards to the dogs at authorized shows by the FCPR shall be printed according to the pre-selected format. The name of the entity must appear with the name of the Federation Cynologique Internationale. The official logo of the FCPR and FCI shall also appear on the certificate. The ideal size should be 8.5" x 11" inches and printed in color.

Chapter 25

The official colors of the FCPR shall be gold, black, brown and mustard yellow. However, a combination of colors using the official color may be used to enhance the official logo to comply with the publicity and promotional plans.

GENERAL RULES:

1. All exhibitors shall respect the authorities at the event, specially the Judge or be subject to immediate and unappealable sanctions by the Show Chairman or representative of the FCPR, including the disqualification of the dog from the competition and the annulment of any prizes and/or qualifications that he may have obtained and even suspension of any right to show dogs in any event organized or authorized by the FCPR in accordance to the degree of the offense.
2. From July 31, 2005, the following rules will be specified in the entries of all dogs, equally to all people.
 - No entries shall be accepted without the FCPR registration number of dogs that are already registered.
 - No entries shall be accepted that are missing information.
 - No entries shall be accepted without fees or partial fees.
 - No entries shall be accepted by e-mail or fax.
 - No entries shall be accepted after 9:00 p.m. at Plaza las Américas of the date the entries close.
 - No dogs shall be entered in the Sub-Novice category in obedience on the day of the show, only on or before the date the entries close.
 - Incomplete entries shall be returned to the remitter without previous notification.
 - The entry form must be completely checked on both sides or it will be returned to the exhibitor without previous notification.

3. In the ring, all exhibitors will refrain from smoking or of acting in any way that might hurt the decorum of the event or the sportsmanship, like spurring one dog against another, trying to mar the presentation of another dog, covering or standing in the way of the judge's view of another animal, double handling or adverse actions towards the FCPR or the judges.
4. At every show an official Veterinarian or Veterinary group shall be appointed that will remain at the place of the event with a first aide bag from the beginning until the end to help any dog that should require medical attention. In some cases, the Veterinary may be "ON CALL", and shall be called by telephone according to the urgency. If it is not urgent, the exhibitor must take the dog to his own veterinarian. In any case, the costs will be the sole responsibility of the owner and not the FCPR.
5. A Judge should never judge a dog during the development of an official show that:
 - a.) He owns or co-owns.
 - b.) Is owned or co-owned by a member of his immediate family (wife, husband, daughter, son, siblings or parents).
 - c.) Has been bred by him, unless the transfer of ownership is dated at least one (1) year before the show date and can be proven with the proper documentation.
3. If the Judge accepts to judge at a show to fill in an emergency caused by the absence or indisposition of the original Judge assigned and there are dogs in the conditions described in section 5, inserts **a.**), **b.**) and **c.**), these must be withdrawn from the competition and the organizing club will reimburse all the owners the cost of the entries.
4. The official entry form may be copied freely on both sides, but must be adjusted to the format, the measurements and the conditions established by the FCPR in these rules.
5. While the judging is taking place the owners of the dogs or the handlers will be responsible for having there dogs at ringside ready to enter so that they may enter when called to be judged and this way not delay the development of the event. The sound system will not be used to call the dogs to compete.
6. The FCPR or the organizing club will not be responsible for the loss or damages to the dogs that are being exhibited even though it might be due to an accident or any other cause. It must be understood that it will be the sole responsibility of the owner if any dog at the show causes physical or material damage to anyone or anything. No entry monies will be returned if it has been duplicated for any reason or after the closing of entries. Entries paid with Visa or Master Card credit cards will be allowed, but at the International shows there will be a \$5.00 fee per dog. The credit card number and the expiration date must be written on the back of the entry.
7. The FCPR or the organizing club may decline to accept any entry or may refuse the admission of any dog due to illness, aggressiveness, etc... If the show does not take place due to riots, civil disturbances, storms or for reasons beyond the control of organizing club or the FCPR, the entry fees will NOT be returned.
8. The FCPR may reserve the right to admit any person or dogs to the show premises.

THE RULES THAT GUIDE THE USE OF A SHOW SITE

1. Respect and care for the facilities.
2. It is prohibited to tie a dog to a crate, gate, tree, tent, awning, regular or electric chair and leave them on their own.
3. The garbage will be deposited in the trash cans assigned for this purpose.
4. The rented or shared spaces will be returned clean at the end of the event.
5. No loose or out of control dogs will be permitted.
6. No games will be permitted inside the facilities except the official ones established by the organization that rented the facilities.
7. After the show has ended there will be a maximum amount of one (1) hour time to vacate the premises.
8. Dogs that are not entered will not be permitted into the premises.
9. It is prohibited to sell puppies at the show premises.

VIOLATIONS AND SANCTIONS TO THESE RULES

I. MISCONDUCT AGAINST A JUDGE

- 1.) Physical and verbal abuse, inappropriate public criticism of a judges' decision, refusal of an award, leaving the ring without the judges consent, not wanting to control a dog in the ring voluntarily and trying to influence a judge, will all be severely penalized by the FCPR.

II. DISORDERLY CONDUCT DURING THE SHOW

- 1.) Physical altercation, verbal abuse, disruptive behavior and provoking problems during the development of the event, will have sanctions imposed by the FCPR.

III. INAPPROPRIATE TREATMENT OF ANIMALS

- 1.) Physical or negligent.

IV. DESTRUCTION OR DAMAGES TO SHOW PREMISES OR THE VENUE HOTELS OF THE EVENTS

- 1.) Changing a dog for another, carrying a fire arm, a knife or drugs.

VI. REGISTRATIONS

- 1.) Falsify documents of the FCPR, selling or buying registrations of the FCPR.

VII. ANY VIOLATION TO ANY SECTION OF THESE RULES

SANCTIONS TO VIOLATIONS

6 MONTHS SUSPENSION, EVEN INDEFINITE EXPULSION ACCORDING TO THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE OFFENSE. THE DECISION WILL BE TAKEN BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE FEDERACIÓN CANÓFILA DE PUERTO RICO.
